

ANTI CATCH UP

Covid 19 Recovery Funding 2021/22 and 2022/23

In addition to this the DfE has allocated £91,000 over these two years to be spent on ensuring that all students have the chance to catch up on any learning lost during the pandemic. This is a high-priority school focus which has been monitored closely over the two years.

Based on guidance from the Educational Endowment Foundation, we have used a 3-tiered approach in how we will allocate this additional funding to support students this academic year:

- 1) Teaching and learning
 - (High-quality teaching for all, effective assessment and feedback, transition support)
- 2) Targeted academic support
 - (High-quality one to one and small group tuition, targeted support and intervention)
- 3) Extended provision
 - (Wider strategies, supporting students, supporting parents and families, access to technology)

Our planning spending is as follows:

Teaching and learning/Targeted academic support:

- Key Stage 4 Literacy Catch-up Resources £4,000
- CAT Testing and Assessment Resources £3,100
- HLTA additional training/resources £2,000
- Literacy Intervention Resources £2,200
- Catch up tutoring through MyTutor Year 11, Year 7, Post-16, targeted students £50,000

Extended provision:

- Student SEMH Interventions £13,300
- Counselling additional day £5,600
- Year 7 Summer School £5,000

We have also used additional Government resources to ensure that that there are no barriers to accessing technology for students at Colton Hills. We ensure that we regularly check that students have access to technology and that they continue to study beyond the school day.

The 16 to 19 tuition fund 2021-22

What is the 16-19 Tuition Fund?

The 16 to 19 tuition fund is additional funding for schools, colleges and all other 16 to 19 institutions. The purpose of this funding is to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19). The funding is to support small group tuition for students aged 16 to 19 in English, maths and other subjects that have been disrupted, including vocational and/or academic learning.

Colton Hills was allocated £14,000 for 16-19 tuition funding in 2021-22 and has spent this allocation.

Which students are eligible to receive support via the 16-19 Tuition Fund?

The 16-19 Tuition Fund is specifically for students who:

- have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or maths.
- have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged background and would need catch-up support.

Students from an economically disadvantaged background have been identified using the Index of Multiple Deprivation. Any student who falls in one of the top 27% most disadvantaged areas of the country is eligible to receive support through the tuition fund.

How have we used the funding?

The money allocated to Colton Hills as part of the 16-19 Tuition Fund has been used to support eligible students in the securing high-quality tutoring through our tutoring partner MyTutor.
