We say goodbye to Mr Williams after one calendar year and wish him well in his new school. Mr Winward joins us on 19th February as our new Pastoral Deputy Headteacher and he will be popping into school to get to know more about us before he takes up post.

Staff training and our school improvement journey

Every school has a development plan to help it improve and one of our key focusses was on driving up school attainment. This year we have held training for staff on adaptive teaching enabling them to address misconceptions promptly and help learners make rapid progress. This is not a one-off training session and is a topic we will review over time. We have asked the local authority to come in to review this work in January and look forward to sharing their feedback in the spring term.

External quality assurance update

Ofsted visited on $14^{th}/15^{th}$ November and have 30 working days to publish the report. It is possible that could mean a January publication and we will share it as quickly as we can. It was a pleasure to work with His Majesty's Inspection team to showcase the wonderful things that happen at Colton Hills Community School.
